2025 CQI Plan Performance Measure Disclaimers

- The Ryan White Part B (RWPB) Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) Plan is not reflective of the totality of services across all funding streams provided by our Regional Grantees/providers to clients, but rather a selected portion.
- CQI Plan data is obtained from the contracts of Ryan White (RW) Rebates and Housing Opportunities for People with AIDS (HOPWA) in CAREWare. Special Pharmaceutical Benefits Program (SPBP) data is obtained from Prime Therapeutics.
- A rolling 12-month calendar year is used for data collection of the 2025 CQI Plan: 1st Review Period: 4/1/2024-3/31/2025, 2nd Review Period: 7/1/2024-6/30/2025, 3rd Review Period: 10/1/2024-9/30/2025, and 4th Review Period: 1/1/2025-12/31/2025.
- Prior to 2024, CQI Plan HIV Viral Load data was collected from CAREWare and the Enhanced HIV/AIDS Reporting System (eHARS) only and did not include the Pennsylvania National Electronic Disease Surveillance System (PA-NEDSS). As of the report period of 4/1/2023-3/31/2024 the 2024 CQI HIV Viral Load information is obtained from CAREWare, eHARS and PA-NEDSS. The HIV Viral Load data is updated bi-annually.

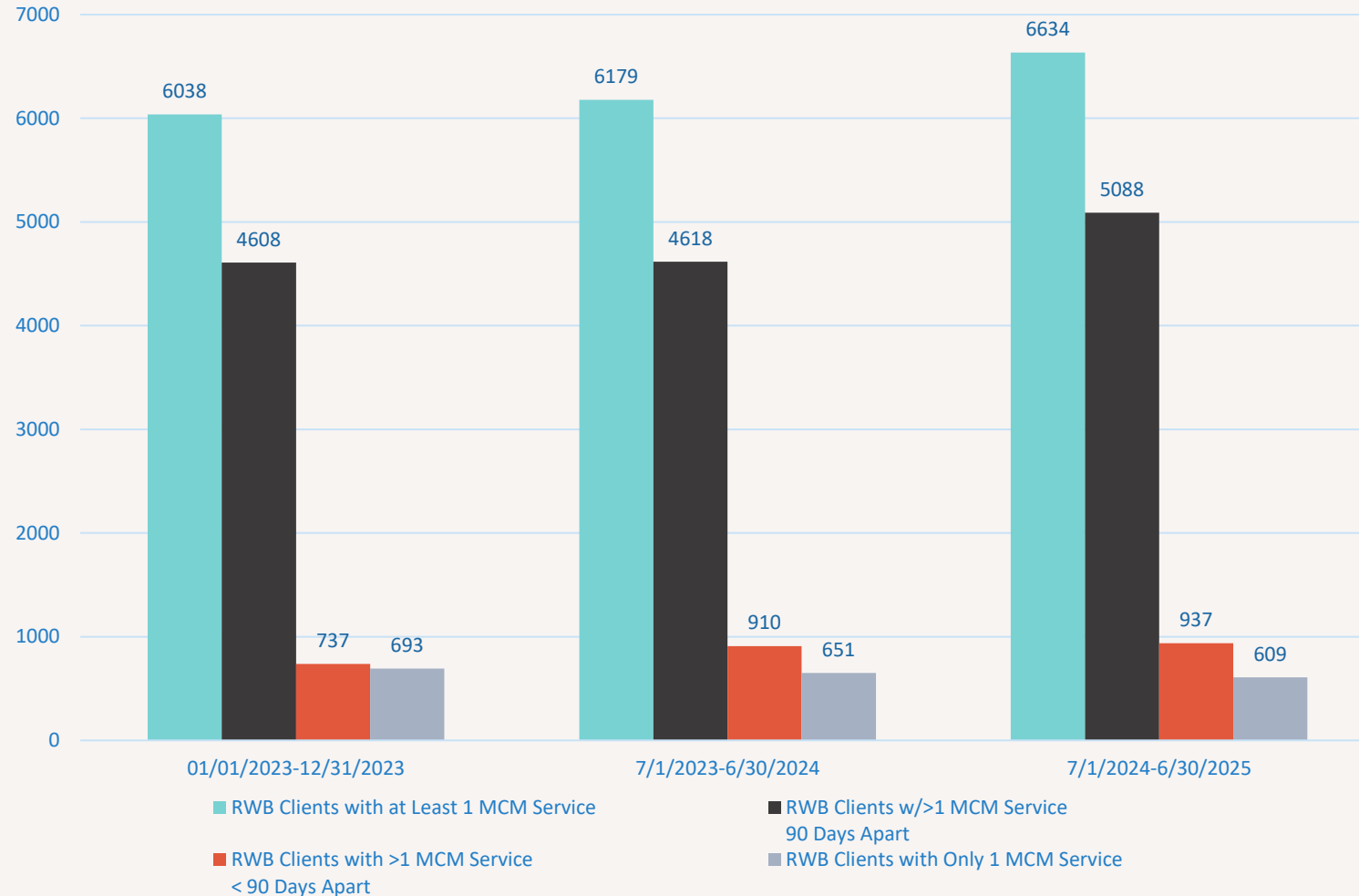


2025 CQI Plan Performance Measure Disclaimers

- As of 4/1/2024-3/31/2025 SPBP HIV Viral Load includes clients with medication claims and premium claims.
- Clients in the HIV Viral Load performance measure cohort *without* a HIV Viral Load may be due to the most recent HIV Viral Load falling outside the 12-month report period.
- An error in the statistical analysis system (SAS) was identified in the quantities field. As of the report period of 4/1/2024-3/31/2025 this error was corrected. The corrected error has resulted in a more accurate reflection of the total number of services provided to RWPB unique clients for each core and support service category.
- SPBP Annual Retention in Service/re-enrollment performance measure: The number of Special Pharmaceutical Benefits Program (SPBP) cardholders who were sent re-enrollment letters do not include cardholders who are now deceased, moved out of state, no longer eligible for the program or appear to be eligible for Medical Assistance (MA) and only given 3 months of SPBP coverage. Individuals that become enrolled in MA are disenrolled from SPBP and are not sent re-enrollment letters.
- As of the report period of 10/1/2024-9/30/2025, CQI Plan performance measure data outcomes excludes clients who died at any time during the measurement year and clients who moved out of Pennsylvania during the measurement year.



2024 CQI Workgroup State-level Quality Improvement Project (QIP)



Medical Case Management (MCM),
Annual Retention in Service

Defined as at least 2 MCM services at least 90-days apart in the 12-month measurement year.



2024 CQI Workgroup State-level QIP Target Condition

- By 12/31/2024 RWPB MCM providers will commit to reviewing program guidance/best practices developed by the CQI Workgroup.
- By 1/31/2025 Regional Grantees will begin planning a process focusing on increasing MCM Annual Retention in Service.
- By 2/28/2025 Regional Grantees and providers will collaborate to begin planning a process focusing on increasing their MCM Annual Retention in Service.
- By 3/31/2025 Regional Grantees and providers will commit to beginning the implementation of a process focusing on increasing their MCM Annual Retention in Service.
- By 6/30/2025 RWPB MCM providers with baseline MCM Annual Retention in Service ranging between 39%-76% (2024 CQI QIP baseline) will increase a minimum of 4%.
- By 6/30/2025 RWPB MCM providers with a baseline MCM Annual Retention in Service rate above 76% will increase a minimum of 1%.
- By 6/30/2026 the state-level average MCM Annual Retention in Service rate will increase from the baseline of 76% to a minimum of 80%.



The CQI Workgroup's 2025 QIP

- The 2024 quality improvement project target condition extends to 6/30/2026.
- The CQI Workgroup reviewed performance measure outcomes for the period of 1/1/2024-12/31/2024.
- Collected a list of quality improvement projects throughout Pennsylvania.
- Community Involvement, community advisory boards (CABs)/community advisory councils (CACs)
